Don't Be Manipulated By the Liberal Media

As you may know, the Harrison Daily Times has reported about a mailing, appearing to come from my office, and received by Cherie Burkner-Webb, a black state representative in Idaho. Here are how some of the headlines in the national media read: Idaho's Only Black Lawmaker gets a KKK Invite - Idaho's only African-American Legislator Receives letter from KKK and Idaho's Only Black Legislator Receives Ku Klux Klan Mailing.

It appeared the entire lamestream media was marching lock-stepped together in an effort to portray this as a calculated attempt to intimidate the one and only black in the Idaho legislature. What the media, including the Harrison Daily Times, failed to mention is that the entire membership of the Idaho legislature also received the same mailing – a detail that any reporter could have found out by making a couple of simple phone calls to the state legislative offices. Not only did the entire Idaho Legislature receive this mailing, but the people who made the mailing had no knowledge of the racial identity of any of the lawmakers. Political information was sent to people holding a political office. Advocates for one cause or another do it all the time. There is nothing sinister about it. But did the *local* paper report this fact? No. You also should be aware that the Harrison Daily Times is not “locally owned and operated” but is part of the large liberal national media industry and is owned by Community Publishers Incorporated and therefore owes loyalty to the corporation and not to the Harrison community.

That the media is overwhelmingly liberal is so well and fully documented that it would be pointless to offer proof and The Weekly Standard stated, “That liberals are dominant [in the news industry] is now beyond dispute.” It is this liberal bias of both the news media and the entertainment media that has been in the forefront of tearing down the values of Western Christian Civilization which you and I hold so dear. The news media and the entertainment media (as well as book/magazine publishers and music producers) are rife with attacks upon the moral foundation of our dear Republic. In all of these mediums we see the continual promotion of abortion, drug abuse, sexual promiscuity, disrespect to parents, and “gay rights.” We also see Jesus Christ and Christianity trashed at every

opportunity. It is this same liberal bias in the media that vehemently attacks and distorts my image and those I represent.

However, as I stated above, every person in the Idaho legislature received the same mailing as well as those in the Wyoming legislature. Only this woman has made it an issue. Why? I moved here with my young family in 1972 because I loved the area and had no interest in changing anything. I am always amazed by people like Jeff "Let's Get Wet" Crockett (Harrison Mayor), Carolyn Cline (Harrison Task Force on Race Relations), Ronnie Bell (Publisher of the Harrison Daily Times) and Terry Cook (local director of Arkansas State Parks and Tourism) all having recently moved into our area because "they said" they loved the community and the people. And then the first thing they do is begin trashing our community, history, values and culture and telling us what we must do to make it better. (Jeanette Fitton from New Zealand and wife of city councilman Dave Fitton is reported to have said the area has too many churches and too many Christians! Remember, the glowing write up of her in the local paper.)

Consider, if these hateful, maladjusted people don't like it why did they move here? And Ronnie Bell, publisher of the Harrison Daily Times has been in Harrison less than 3 years and he joins those with the Task Force on Race Relations telling us how horrible and racist our Harrison forefathers and mothers were. They are quick to claim my presence is hurting the economic growth of Harrison. When in fact, Harrison and Boone county is one of the best places to live in Arkansas and has experienced tremendous growth because of what we are and not what they want us to become.

Now these self-appointed leaders of our community [because of positions that money and influence can buy] have prepared a letter of apology to Representative Cherie Buckner-Webb. According to the April 14-15 edition of the Harrison Daily Times they are going to be asking local citizens to sign the letter which is also an invitation for her to come and visit our community. The letter is intended to further the fundamental change in Harrison and encourage a large increase of minorities into the area.

I know that some of you may think this would be a good thing, but consider once the change occurs, and we lose our unique heritage and our cultural identity there is no going back. Certainly "minorities" are free to move here if they wish, but the manipulation of your compassion for the furtherance of white genocide by assimilation is both repulsive and insidious. Furthermore, an apology from this community to a woman who reflects ideals, morals and values that this community believes to be shameful is particularly disturbing.
